Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem, they would not be able to survive. It was moving to visit and pray with them in the holy sites, but it was just as moving to hear what Orders like the Equestrian Order of Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem has done for them despite the obstacles.



Glory be to the FATHER and the SON and the HOLY SPIRIT....






Connie's Corner

What are you doing to prepare?







JUSTICE & PEACE...Freedom of movement is something we take for granted—going from town to town, county to county, or state to state. It's never been a high priority in Israel. After the war, two Israeli ministers say it will probably get worse.

National Security Minister Itamar Ben Gvir recently stated, "The right to life for Jewish residents in the West Bank is more important than the freedom of movement for residents of the Palestinian Authority. I expect that there will be more and more checkpoints, that there will be restrictions. Our enemies do not look for excuses, our enemies just want to harm us."

Besides checkpoints, Palestinians are not allowed on all of the roads that Israelis travel on. Calls to limit access even further, came from Settlements Minister Orit Strock, who wrote on X. Terrorists take "advantage of the reckless and unjust 'freedom of movement' which also allows terrorists... to travel alongside us on our arterial roads (while they have alternative roads)"—a reference to the use of West Bank roads by both Israelis and Palestinians.

She said the greater number of cars on the shared roads "creates traffic congestion and traffic jams that generate victims for terrorist attacks. It's time to fix this; our blood is no less red."

Ordinary life for Christian Palestinians continually gets harder and harder. Thank goodness they have the strength to persevere \bigwedge \blacksquare .

They have a soft spot for the Orders' work in Hogar des Ninos and Deacon Ryan's Our Lady of Palestine ministry.




LVC MEN'S BOOK CLUB...We've finished discussing "Ethics for Beginners" by Peter Kreeft. 'Ethics' per se opened numerous channels of questioning and areas for discussion. It seems that every next book we read leads to better discussions. Kreeft's introduction caused, in words of all of us "our best discussion to date"

As an example of a discussion starter that came shortly after Kreeft's introduction. A most striking observation was ... "Ethics is an essential dimension of every religion in the world. ... religions ... very different in their theologies, are not very different in their ethics. They ... (all) demand the overcoming of our basic egotism or selfishness." And off we went ... to read the thoughts, views and contrast between some of the greatest philosophical minds of the centuries.

Our next book is "The Scarlet Letter" by Nathaniel Hawthorne published in 1850. In an annotated version "A Guide to Reading & Reflecting" by Karen Swallow Prior. The things we kind of knew about the book (as it was required reading for some in High School)...sin, morality, guilt and social consequences, are just the surface. Dr Prior states ... She'll " not only navigate you (us) through the pitfalls that trap readers today but show you (us) how to read it in light of the gospel, and the glory of God." The book is an 'American Classic' which certainly ranks among the best ever written.

Over the past few days, we have been discussing what really is the act of surrender? And we both agree that there are two distinct surrenders. 1) Human surrender and 2) Surrender to Almighty God.

As humans, the act of surrender is depicted by waving the white flag. I GIVE UP, DON'T SHOOT!" Generally followed by imprisonment and punishment...you have been beaten, defeated and humiliated. Maybe this is why surrender gets a bad rap!

Now think of surrendering to the Messiah. Realizing all the hurt, wrongs and pain you have caused yourself and others. Approaching Jesus in your lowest and weakest point...defeated. The white flag of sin you carry is taken from your hands, you ask for forgiveness and like the prodigal son, he places upon you the inheritance of grace, peace, joy and soon eternal life. This is what "Giving Up" in Lent is all about. When surrendering to God you come back to him like a newly baptized child in love and peace. As Jesus, when you surrender like this, says in Mathew 18:2...."unless you change and become like little children, you will never enter the Kingdom of Heaven."
