In addition to daily Mass and learning about a vibrant spirituality, we'll also experience wonderful Irish meals and festivities, song and conversation, as well as the contemporary realities of Irish life. OUR DAILY ITINERARY

DAY 1, MONDAY, MAY 25: DEPART USA

We depart on our non-stop flight from Los Angeles to Dublin, with complimentary meals and beverages served on board.

DAY 2, TUESDAY, MAY 26: FAILTE (WELCOME) TO DUBLIN / GALWAY

Upon arrival in Dublin, we meet our tour manager and we board our waiting motor coach to transport us to the city of Galway to check-in to our hotel. Dinner follows at the hotel restaurant. (D)

DAY 3, WEDNESDAY, MAY 27: GALWAY: EXCURSION TO KNOCK & BALLINTUBBER ABBEY

This morning, we enjoy an excursion to Knock, visited each year by more than 1.5 million pilgrims. Upon arriving here as a pilgrim in the autumn of 1979, Pope John Paul II declared: "Now I am at the goal of my pilgrimage to Ireland!" After our Mass, we enjoy a tour of the grounds with our guide to learn the story of the apparitions here and we will have time to pray the Stations of the Cross on Calvary Hill. Lunch is included at Knock Hotel.

We continue our journey to Ballintubber Abbey for a guided visit. Built in 1216 for the Canon Regulars of St Augustine, Ballintubber Abbey is the only church in Ireland that was founded by an Irish King and which is still in use today. It was built next to the site of an earlier church founded by St Patrick in the 5th century. It is also known as 'the Abbey that refused to die' as through its many vicissitudes, including burning by Cromwell's army in 1653, the Abbey has remained a place of worship despite years of continuous attacks and religious repression.

Ballintubber retains an air of ancient beauty and spirituality and has been restored with simple elegance and it remains one of the most impressive church buildings in Ireland today. There is a video display and an interpretative centre at the Abbey and the grounds are landscaped to portray spiritual themes. This was the traditional starting point for the annual pilgrimage to the Holy Mountain of Croagh Patrick. After our tour here, we return to Galway. Dinner is included this evening at our hotel. (B, L, D)

DAY 4, THURSDAY, MAY 28: GALWAY: EXCURSION TO CLIFFS OF MOHER

After breakfast and Mass this morning, we travel to the Cliffs of Moher, sheer cliffs dropping 600 feet to the water below, one of the most impressive stretches of shoreline on the west coast of Ireland.

Situated on the Atlantic Ocean and bordering the Burren region, the Cliffs of Moher are one of Ireland's most spectacular sights. Standing 230 metres above the ground at their highest point and nearly five miles long, the Cliffs boast one of the most amazing views in Ireland. The sweeping view across the Atlantic has recently been ranked the best 'cliff-view' on the planet by Conde Nast Traveler. We enjoy an included lunch at a local pub in the nearby village of Doolin. We make our way back to Galway for a panoramic tour of the town, then return to our hotel. You might want to explore the local restaurants tonight in Galway, as dinner is on our own this evening. (B, L)

DAY 5, FRIDAY, MAY 29: GALWAY / ADARE / GLENSTAL ABBEY / CORK

After breakfast and checkout, we travel to the charming village of Adare, famous for its thatched roof cottages. We continue to Glenstal Abbey, a Benedictine monastery in County Limerick. An estate with streams, lakes and woodland paths, surrounds a castle built

in Norman style. The abbey, which is dedicated to Saints Joseph and Columba, is home to a community of monks. Prayer and liturgical celebration combine with managing a boarding school for boys, a farm, and a guest house. The Monks of Glenstal are world renowned for their Gregorian chant recordings. We are invited to join the monks for prayer. After our visit, Mass, and time for lunch on our own, we continue to our hotel in Cork for check-in. Dinner is served at our hotel in Cork. (B, D)

DAY 6, SATURDAY, MAY 30 CORK: EXCURSION TO COBH HERITAGE CENTRE & JAMESON DISTILLERY

This morning, after breakfast, we travel the short distance to Cobh to visit the Cobh Heritage Centre, which tells the story of the two million-plus emigrants who departed from Cobh Harbor to foreign lands. Cobh was also the last port of call for the Titanic before she sank. A unique Irish port town, Cobh is situated on the southern shore of the Great Island in one of the world's finest natural harbors. Between 1848 and 1950, over 6 million adults and children emigrated from Ireland including over 2.5 million from Cobh, making it the single most important port of emigration in the country.

The Heritage Centre is located in the old Victorian Railway station in Cobh formally known as Queenstown. The Centre hosts a multi-media exhibition of the Origins, History and Legacy of Cobh. The Queenstown Story relates Cobh's dramatic maritime history including how it was the last port of call for the ill-fated Titanic. The steamers and ocean liners continued carrying the Irish to new lives and new lands for many years afterwards. Cobh Heritage Centre now offers a genealogy service, where the staff can assist you in tracing your Irish Ancestors.

After our tour, we celebrate Mass at Cobh's St. Colman's Cathedral, followed by a pub lunch. Next, we continue to Midleton, near Cork, for our "Jameson Experience" at the Midleton Distillery, with its Irish Whiskey Museum. Set on 15 acres and beautifully restored, this is where the true heart of Irish whiskey is born. Our old distillery is a unique experience with some of the buildings dating back to 1795. We take a journey through history and see the old kilns, mills and malting, water wheel and old warehouses. After our tasting, we return to Cork and dinner is on our own to explore the local dining scene. (B, L)

DAY 7, SUNDAY, MAY 31: CORK / BLARNEY CASTLE / WOOLLEN MILLS / KILLARNEY

Attracting visitors from all over the world, Blarney Castle is situated in Blarney village, five miles from Cork city. An ancient stronghold of the McCarthy's, Lords of Muskerry, it is one of Ireland's oldest and most historic castles, and one of the strongest fortresses in Munster. Built in 1446, Blarney Castle is famous for its Blarney stone, the Stone of Eloquence, which is traditionally believed to have the power to bestow the gift of eloquence on all those who kiss it. Many legends tell the story of the Stone, but why not kiss it and find out the truth behind the legend.

After our tour, we celebrate Mass at the Church of the Immaculate Conception, located nearby the Castle, followed by some time on our own for lunch and shopping.

No trip to Ireland is complete without a visit to the legendary Blarney Woollen Mills. With five locations across Ireland, including the successful Blarney location just outside Cork City, Blarney Woollen Mills offers an essential Irish shopping experience. Originally established in 1823, Blarney Woollen Mills now houses a large selection of Irish products. Visit "The largest Irish store in the world" where you will find a wide selection of sweaters and woollens, crystal, gifts and souvenirs for all the family, this famous store has something for everyone. We continue to our hotel in Killarney for check-in. Dinner this evening is served at our hotel. (B, D)

DAY 8, MONDAY, JUNE 1: KILLARNEY: DINGLE PENINSULA & GALLARUS ORATORY

After breakfast, we set out for the Dingle Peninsula, famous for its Celtic pre-Christian monuments and its early Christian sites. It is also a 'Gaeltacht' (Irish speaking) area, where the Irish language and traditional ways of life are preserved. We visit Gallarus Oratory, built between the 6th and 9th centuries, which is among the best of the surviving examples of early Christian churches in Ireland. This area was an embarkation point for pilgrims on their way to Santiago de Compostela to visit the shrine of St. James.

The road around the Peninsula passes through a mountain chain called Slieve Mish. From Inch, we see a long beach bordered by dunes and made famous by David Lean's movie "Ryan's Daughter." From Dingle town, we drive around the coast to Sleah Head, where we can take in a view of the deserted Blasket Islands

and see the Skellig Michael from another angle. We enjoy a pub lunch in Dingle, followed by Mass at St. Mary's Church in Dingle. We return to our hotel for dinner on our own. (B, L)

DAY 9, TUESDAY, JUNE 2: KILLARNEY / ST. PATRICK & ROCK OF CASHEL / ST. BRIGID / DUBLIN

After breakfast and checkout, we celebrate Mass at St. Mary's Cathedral in Killarney, then travel to the Rock of Cashel, possibly the most photographed site in Ireland and one of Ireland's leading tourist attractions. Here in 450 AD St. Patrick baptized King Aengus.

The Rock of Cashel towers over the town of Cashel from its perch on a 200-foot high outcrop of limestone. Once the seat of the Kings of Munster. St. Patrick visited the rock in 450 AD, while Brian Boru was crowned the first high King of Ireland here in the tenth century. Granted to the church in the twelfth century, by the O'Brien clan, today the impressive stone walls enclose a round tower, a cathedral, a twelfth century Romanesque chapel and high crosses. After our visit, we have some time for lunch on our own.

Back on the road, we make our way north to County Kildare, where we pause to pray at the humble St. Brigid's Well, honoring another patron saint of the Emerald Isle. Brigid died around 525 AD. She is often depicted with a flame and a book, symbolizing her fiery name and great learning, and is associated with the famous St. Brigid's Cross. We arrive at our hotel in Dublin for dinner and the evening. (B, D)

DAY 10, WEDNESDAY, JUNE 3: DUBLIN: VISIT OF THE CITY, BOOK OF KELLS & VISIT OF GUINNESS STOREHOUSE

This morning, after breakfast and our Mass, we enjoy a panoramic sightseeing tour of the city. Our itinerary includes O'Connell Street the exterior of the Customs House and the Old Parliament building, Georgian squares, Viking Dublin and Phoenix Park. We visit Trinity College where we see an exhibit on the famous Book of Kells, and illustrated manuscript and Celtic Gospel book in Latin, containing the four Gospels of the New Testament.

Trinity College was founded in 1592 by Queen Elizabeth 1st on grounds confiscated from an Augustinian priory and is the oldest university in Ireland. The Campanile, erected in 1852, was built on what is believed to be the centre of the monastery.

Built to further the education of the ruling Anglo-Irish families, restrictions were imposed to prevent Catholic from attending courses. These restrictions were not fully lifted until the 1970's. Trinity however admitted women in 1902, earlier than most British universities.

After our included pub lunch, we visit the Guinness Brewery, Europe's largest stout producing brewery and home to the Guinness Storehouse. Opened in 1904, the Storehouse was an operational plant for fermenting and storing Guinness. Today it houses a very fine exhibition dedicated to the Guinness story. Visitors will discover what goes into the making a pint of Guinness - the ingredients, the brewing process, the time, the craft and the passion. The exhibition shows how the brew has been marketed and how it is today sold in over 150 countries. The star attraction is undoubtedly the top-floor Gravity Bar with 360-degree floor-to-ceiling glass walls that offer a nonpareil view over the city while you sip your free pint. Dinner this evening is on our own to explore the local restaurants. (B, L)

DAY 11, THURSDAY, JUNE 4: DUBLIN: EXCURSION TO GLENDALOUGH & IRISH CABARET DINNER

This morning, after breakfast, we depart for Glendalough – the Glen between the Two Lakes, one of Ireland's most beloved early Monastic sites. It was here that St. Kevin, son of the king of Leinster, founded a monastery in the 6th century. According to legend, St. Kevin retired to this spot to be alone, living as a hermit for years. When his followers became too numerous, he was compelled to found a monastic community to accommodate them, the ruins of which we can still see here today. In time, this community became a great center of learning known as "Rome of the West." From a simple beginning the site grew to become famous as a centre of learning throughout Europe. Standing for 600 years it was destroyed in 1398. Much of what we will see today dates from the 10th to 12th century. Lunch is included at a nearby restaurant.

After our included lunch, we will celebrate Mass in St. Kevin's Church, the closing Mass of our pilgrimage together. We make our way back to Dublin, stopping to enjoy our farewell dinner at a local restaurant with musical entertainment. The show is a highly entertaining performance of live traditional Irish music, song and Irish dancing. From start to finish, this is a show based on fantastic interaction between the performers and the audience. (B, L D)

DAY 12, FRIDAY, JUNE 5: SLAN LEAT (GOOD BYE) TO IRELAND

After breakfast and checkout, our pilgrimage concludes. We transfer to the airport for our return flight to the USA. (B)

Notes: 1) *You will clear U.S. Customs and Immigration at the Dublin Airport, a special arrangement between the USA and Ireland, so you will need to plan to get to the airport with extra time to go through this process;* 2) *While no changes are anticipated, there might be occasions when certain alterations become necessary to the itinerary, due to changes in airline schedules or for any other reason. All Masses are subject to final Church schedules.*

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

ACCEPTANCE OF TERMS & CONDITIONS: Any payments made by a Traveler or on behalf of the Traveler ("Traveler", "you") to Catholic Travel Centre (CTC) toward any CTC tour shall constitute acceptance of all Terms & Conditions provided herein.

PAYMENT TERMS: All payments shall be made on the dates indicated in the payment schedule, noted in the Registration Information section. Late payments are subject to a non-refundable \$150 fee, and may result in cancellation. A Traveler registering within 120 days prior to departure must provide full payment by cashier check, plus a non-refundable late registration \$150 fee. CTC reserves the right to cancel registrations not paid in full 105 days prior to tour departure and to charge fees per the Cancellation Policy. A non-refundable \$75 fee is charged on all returned payments. Travelers agree not to dispute any credit card charges associated with this trip before contacting CTC first to resolve their concerns. CTC retains the right to dispute any chargeback that is improper and recover any costs, including attorney's fees related to improper chargebacks. Additionally, in the event of an improper chargeback, CTC retains the right to cancel any travel reservation related to that improper chargeback. **NOTE:** Credit card charges will not show as "travel expense" on your credit card statement, but will appear as "specialty services", "shopping" or another designation.

CHANGES IN PACKAGE: After initial invoicing, changes from the air inclusive package ("Full Package") to "Land Only" or vice versa are subject to a non-refundable \$75 per person per change fee. Changes must be requested in writing to CTC at least 130 days prior to departure date (subject to availability). Late requests to change the package may not be accommodated.

CHANGES IN FORM OF PAYMENT: To change from Cash Discount to Standard pricing, the difference between prices plus an additional \$75 fee applies. After a Traveler's credit card has been charged for any portion of the tour, s/he is ineligible for the Cash Discount Price.

PARTIAL PACKAGES NOT AVAILABLE: Tour Packages are offered as described in this brochure, at the stated price. Partial package purchase is not available.

INDIVIDUAL CANCELLATION POLICY: CTC's cancellation policy is in effect upon first payment toward any CTC tour. A Traveler's cancellation must be provided in writing either by email, fax, or registered mail to CTC. The cancellation by the Traveler is effective on the date of the cancellation email, fax, or date of postmark. The Traveler forfeits the following fees to CTC based on the date of cancellation notice: anytime up to 150 days prior to departure, \$500 fee; 149 to 120 days prior to departure, \$1,000; 119 to 90 days prior to departure, \$1,000 fee plus 25% of Land Cost (all costs except airfare and related taxes, fees, surcharges); 89 to 60 days prior to departure, \$1,000 fee plus 50% of Land Cost plus the full cost of all of the Traveler's airline travel (including airfare and related taxes, fees, surcharges); 59 days or fewer, all payments by Traveler made to CTC are forfeited, and there are no refunds. In event of individual cancellation, no name changes or substitutions are permitted. **No shows:** Passengers who do not show up for the group's departing flight (or land only passengers who do not show for first hotel night) will be considered as tour cancellations: their airline and/or hotel reservations will automatically be cancelled and cannot be reinstated.

CTC is not responsible for costs or fees related to itinerary changes necessitated by changes in an airline's schedule or other arrangements not made through CTC.

FINAL TRAVEL DOCUMENTS: Travelers receive travel documents approximately two weeks prior to departure. Bulk items such as luggage and names tags will be shipped by CTC to group leaders for distribution.

ACCOMMODATIONS AND MEALS: Accommodations are based on double/twin rooms with private bathroom facilities. A limited number of single rooms are available and are subject to a single room supplement fee. If no roommate is available for you, or your roommate cancels prior to departure, a single room supplement surcharge applies.
